ENRICHMENT WORKSHOPS

Fourth and Fifth Grade

Math Workshop will give students the opportunity to expand their knowledge of geometry and increase spatial awareness through the exploration of three-dimensional forms, puzzles, patterns, diagrams, and logic problems. Students will use architectural tools such as a triangular scale, architect's ruler, and an Alvin parallel glider. Language Arts Workshops will use a novel as a springboard to delve into character development, plot prediction, personification, symbolism, foreshadowing, and point of view. Students will learn to apply these skills in their own writing. The writing process will be used to learn how to compose an effective paragraph, essay, short story, or "quick writes." Organizational skills, critical thinking skills, reading for deeper meaning and insight, editing and proofreading, the use of rich and expressive vocabulary, and the proper use of grammar and punctuation will be taught and practiced. Each workshop will offer different activities.

The algebraic and geometric concepts covered will range in difficulty from beginner to advanced level. The workshop will also provide the opportunity to focus on improving accuracy and test-taking skills. DEBATE WORKSHOPS

Sixth through Eighth Grade

Debaters learn the basics of verbal and nonverbal communication, effective public speaking skills, argumentation and rebuttal, the utilization of internet resources to research topics, and the rules of Middle School Team Debate. Practice speeches and debates cement these skills. In addition, debaters learn and practice the art of heckling, strategic uses of points of information, and how to appeal to judges. Students will work with others to form three-person teams that will participate in practice debates that simulate actual debate tournament conditions. The Dorris-Eaton School is a member of the East Bay Debate League, which is affiliated with the national Middle School Public Debate Program. **NOTE: Afternoon workshops are a repeat of morning workshops.**

ROBOTICS WORKSHOPS

Sixth through Eighth Grade

Utilizing the VEX Robotics curriculum developed by Carnegie Mellon University, students will be guided through the planning phase of building a robot. They will receive feedback on their design as their plans result in the construction of a virtual robot. Through the VEX platform, students will explore important STEM fundamentals and computer science concepts. Students will also engage in a series of exciting challenges that put their VEX programming skills to the test. **NOTE: Workshop II is a repeat of Workshop I.**

MATH COMPETITION WORKSHOPS

Sixth through Eighth Grade

Advanced math workshops will focus on the different areas of middle school math competitions. Through lectures and individual/group activities, these challenging workshops will cover various demanding mathematical topics which are found on high school standardized math tests and in worldwide math competitions.

AMC8 AND AMC10: The AMC8 is a 40-minute, 25-question, multiple choice exam for middle school students which is designed to promote the development and enhancement of mathematical problem-solving skills. Many problems are designed to challenge students and to offer problem-solving experiences beyond those provided in most junior high school mathematics classes. The AMC10 is a 75-minute, 25-question, multiple choice exam in secondary school mathematics containing problems which can be understood and solved with algebra, geometry, trigonometry, and pre-calculus concepts. The competition is offered to 10th grade students and below.

MATHCOUNTS: A national middle school competitive mathematics program that promotes math achievement through a series of engaging "bee" style contests with challenging application problems from all fields of math.

SAT Math: Students will explore topics in the old and new version of the high school level SAT.

ACT Math: Students will explore topics covered on the current high school level ACT test.
